HEALTH AND HAPPINESS



GREATER CHINA CHILDREN'S HEART FUND

Congenital heart defect (CHD) is the most common type of birth defect, and it is the leading cause of infant mortality in China. Approximately 216,000 infants with CHD are born every year; many of these children don't receive timely treatment due to their families' inability to pay for the heart surgery. In 2018, the Greater China Children's Heart Fund (GCCHF) provided critical heart surgeries to 1,454 children with congenital heart defect (CHD) and provided 20,621 children with free screenings—480 were diagnosed as CHD. Over the course of 2018, 131 volunteers accompanied 393 children with CHD for 524 hours of their screenings and treatment.

SOUTHEAST ASIA CHILDREN'S HEART FUND

The Southeast Asia Children's Heart Fund (SEACHF) provides an opportunity for low-income children with congenital heart disease in Thailand, the Philippines, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, and Vietnam to receive critical heart surgeries. Last year, 912 children got the surgeries they needed. The Fund has been able to continue its efforts through the generous donations from Nu Skin sales leaders and since 1999 it has provided grants to help more than 10,600 children receive lifesaving heart surgeries. At the end of 2018, more than 17,000 sales leaders in Southeast Asia committed to donating 1% commission to the Southeast Asia Children's Heart Fund.

EPIDERMOLYSIS BULLOSA MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB) is a devastating skin disorder that ranges in severity from mild to fatal. Patients are nicknamed "butterfly children" because their skin is as fragile as butterfly wings. Since 1996, the Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation has provided grants to the Epidermolysis Bullosa Medical Research Foundation (EBMRF), which funds research at Stanford University School of Medicine's Department of Dermatology. Funding primarily comes from Nu Skin's commitment to donate US \$0.25 from the sale of each Epoch® Glacial Marine Mud product to EBMRF. Nu Skin Korea sales leaders also generously donate money to support EB patients and research at Gangnam Hospital.

SYRIAN REFUGEES: EMEA

In 2018, Nu Skin EMEA expanded its support for the families of Syrian refugees. In support of International Women's Day, 600 additional women and young adult girls received life-skills training sessions aimed at enhancing self-confidence, adapting to difficult circumstances, and learning hygiene and positive social interaction. This effort came on the heels of supporting more than 6,270 refugees in 2017.

QUIERO VER (I WANT TO SEE): COLUMBIA, ARGENTINA, AND UNITED STATES

The Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation and CharityVision partner to provide free eye screenings and eye glasses for low-income children in Columbia, Argentina, and the United States. More than 2,697 pairs of glasses were given to kids, enabling them to see clearly in their classrooms. Since the program started in 2015, nearly 30,877 children have been screened for visual health impairments in 134 schools.

WELLS OF HOPE: MALAWI

The Foundation provided funds to drill 55 water wells in villages throughout Malawi. These wells were given to the School of Agriculture for Family Independence (SAFI) and SAFI Extension families to help provide access to clean water.

NU VOLUNTEER: MAINLAND CHINA

Nu Volunteer is a platform for Nu Skin staff and business partners in Mainland China to help others by participating in volunteer activities. In 2018, more than 7,130 volunteers contributed 28,593 hours and brought smiles and happiness to 26,158 elders.

FOOD ASSISTANCE TO CHILDREN: JAPAN

In 2018, Nu Skin Japan donated funds each month to Second Harvest Japan to provide food to 7,000 children in 120 foster homes. Since the partnership began in 2006, Nu Skin Japan has donated more than US \$3 million to the food bank.

EDUCATE THE CHILDREN: MALAWI

Educate the Children (ETC), in partnership with the Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation, provides scholarships to secondary and post-secondary students who are children of families in the SAFI and SAFI Extension programs. These scholarships allow children who come from families with very little means to get the educations they need to lift themselves and their communities out of poverty. The scholarships cover the costs of their tuition, uniforms and books. In 2018, ETC gave scholarships to 37 new students and continued to support 151 other students, removing the financial burden of education and enabling them to take full advantage of their school years.

NU HOPE LIBRARY: KOREA

In 2018, Nu Skin Korea completed a library at Maam Elementary School, making it the 22nd Nu Hope library. These libraries provide facilities, materials, and technology-based learning tools to help low-income students living in rural areas of Korea get the resources they need to continue their educations. As a result of these 22 libraries, 6,700 children now have access to tools that will enable them to learn and achieve their educational goals.

NU SKIN PARENTAL EDUCATION, WE ARE ALL MOTHERS: KOREA

We Are All Mothers was launched by the Nu Skin Korea Force For Good Committee in 2016. The committee supports immigrant mothers with multicultural parenting education to help with their integration into Korean society and provide education for their children. The Committee donated US \$100,000 to this program in 2018. Furthermore, the project was awarded the Korea Social Contribution award, which is the most reputable award supported by the National Assembly for the contribution of multicultural family support. Since the program started, US \$296,000 has been donated and a total of 264 families have benefited.

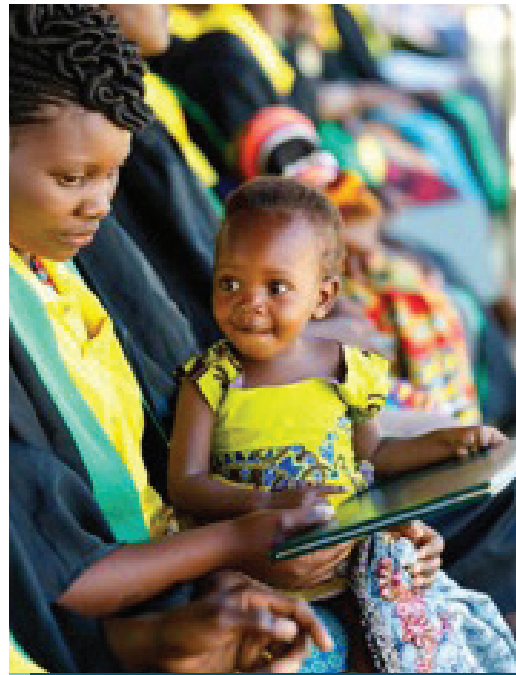
SEACOLOGY

The Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation partners with Seacology to bring unique solutions to the issues of poverty and environmental conservation. Through partnerships with local islanders, Seacology helps villagers learn practices to preserve marine habitats, and in exchange, Seacology builds schools, community centers, water systems, and health clinics to improve the lives of children in the villages. For over 25 years, Seacology has helped protect 1.34 million acres of marine habitat, and just this year, with funds from the Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation, they provided a mangrove education center and boardwalk in Bangladesh, a community center in Madagascar, and built a women's meeting center in Micronesia.

THE LEADER IN ME: JAPAN

Nu Skin Japan's Leader in Me project helps children prepare for the future by teaching them leadership skills. This program is based on Stephen R. Covey's book, *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. Throughout the year, children learn the necessary skills to become leaders and understand how to make positive changes. In 2018, 5,669 students at 13 elementary schools in Japan participated in this program.

TEACHING SKILLS THROUGH ECONOMIC SELF-RELIANCE



Through the School of Agriculture for Family Independence (SAFI), farming families in Malawi get the opportunity to refine their agricultural techniques and learn best practices of agribusiness and nutrition to become self-reliant and provide the best possible future for their children. Many families' lives have been transformed by the skills they learn at SAFI, enabling them to help their children go to school and create a brighter future. Each graduated family progresses with these new techniques and has the responsibility to pass these principles on to other community members.

REBUILDING AFTER THE STORM



Nu Skin's mission is to be a force for good in the world, particularly in times of disaster. In 2018, the Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation provided support to victims of the earthquakes and tsunamis that left hundreds of thousands of houses, schools, mosques, and other facilities ruined throughout Indonesia.

Nu Skin focused its support in the areas of Lombok, Palu, and Donggala, resulting in 50 temporary houses, plus household utilities such as stoves, shelves, and fans to help the affected families rebuild their lives. The Foundation also helped rebuild several mosques and constructed eight temporary toilets.

MEET ALEX AND GETRUDE



Alex, 35, and Getrude, 35, come from Nagala Village in Lilongwe District where they live in their relative's house made of mud and grass. They have been married 12 years and have four children: Caroline, 13; Triza, 10; Esther, 6; and Shyness, 2. Though they work very hard to cultivate their one acre of land, they don't have enough food to last until the next harvest, forcing them to rely on piecework to raise money for food.

The Manganis only grow maize but hope that through the principles they learn at SAFI, they will be able to properly manage their farming business, establish a hunger-free home that is decently furnished, and have enough surplus income to rear livestock.



SAFI EXTENSION: MALAWI

The SAFI Extension partners with the Nu Skin Force for Good Foundation and trains government agriculture workers to provide agricultural education to families and communities. While the SAFI campus only has the capacity to house 30–40 families, the SAFI Extension allows for more families to be taught and apply these life-changing principles. During 2018, the SAFI Extension trained more than 1,300 farmers giving them the skills they need to be self-reliant. In total, the SAFI Extension program has trained 5,785 farmers in Malawi.

SEEDS OF HOPE: MALAWI

Fruit trees change the lives of vulnerable children by providing nourishment for them and a source of income for their families. Through the Seeds of Hope program, more than 36,000 fruit trees were purchased and planted in 2018. Indigenous trees that produce guava, pawpaw, avocado, and other fruits were distributed to 9,000 households. The program is funded in part through a US \$0.25 contribution from the sale of each unit of Epoch® Baobab Body Butter.

174 Syrian refugees were able to move back home and start rebuilding their lives as their damaged houses were rebuilt before winter arrived.

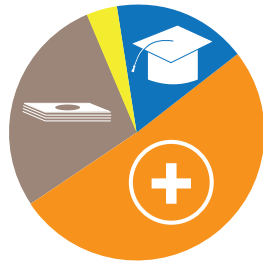

NU SKIN FORCE FOR GOOD DAY CREATING SMILES AROUND THE GLOBE

In June of 2018, sales leaders, employees, customers, and volunteers from more than 20 countries worked together to make the world a better place and improve the lives of children by celebrating Nu Skin's annual Force for Good Day.

AMERICAS

CANADA

Nu Skin Canada employees raised awareness of the Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB) disease and provided comfort to affected families as they hosted their annual Good Butterfly Day event at the Cambridge Butterfly Conservatory.

COLUMBIA

The Nu Skin Latin America team organized a free eye screening for children.

UNITED STATES

Nu Skin and its employees partnered with United Way of Utah County and Provo City to paint, clean, and beautify nearly 15 local elementary schools and city parks.

EUROPE MIDDLE EAST AND AFRICA

EMEA

Nu Skin employees enjoyed a spirited walking/biking competition with each other to raise money to purchase clothing and food for children in need.

BELGIUM

A series of activities were organized, and money collected from the events went to children in need.

DENMARK/NORWAY

Nu Skin employees crocheted stuffed animals for children at hospitals across Denmark. Those animals were given to premature babies in neonatal wards, children with long-term illnesses, or children visiting emergency rooms.

HUNGARY

Each year, children in need are gifted boxes containing toys, food, and other supplementary products.

NETHERLANDS

Nu Skin employees sold baked goods and the donations collected went to purchase necessary items for an orphanage in Romania.

SOUTH AFRICA

Nu Skin South Africa hosted a charity event for the Kids Haven Orphanage, which cares for more than 150 orphans. The market also donated additional funds to upgrade the facility.

RUSSIA/UKRAINE

Nu Skin employees cleaned, painted a playground, and hosted a picnic for the children on the grounds of a local orphanage.

GREATER CHINA

TAIWAN

Sales leaders and employees collected more than 1,400 books for children in Taiwan who lack reading resources. Employees also read books to disabled children.

HONG KONG/MACAU

The team held two events focused on caring for underprivileged elders and students. Nu Skin employees and sales leaders showed love to the elders by giving them "hearty rice dumplings" and spreading joy. The second event encouraged sales leaders and employees to donate books to students from low income families. More than 200 books were donated to the students.

MAINLAND CHINA

A "green" initiative was launched on Force for Good Day in China that encouraged sales leaders and employees to be eco-friendly. All of the Nu Skin stores in mainland China accepted empty Nu Skin® product plastic bottles to recycle. For every 10 plastic bottles the sales leaders turned in at EXPOs, they were rewarded with a souvenir made from recycled material. In 2018, 538,477 empty bottles had been recycled, which saved the energy equivalent to 196,052.24 kWh.

In addition, throughout the month of June, Nu Skin Greater China collected books, toys, and stationery. More than 29,000 items were distributed to children who live in poverty.

NORTH ASIA

JAPAN

Employees and sales leaders created 1,900 stationery sets as part of the Kits for Kids project and delivered them to the children at elementary schools affected by the 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake.

KOREA

Forty staff and some sales leaders in Korea made 2,000 Twinkling Gift Boxes for Good Neighbors, the biggest international relief and development organization in Korea, which supports teenage girls by donating sanitary pads. Nu Skin Korea, the sole company that supports Good Neighbor, also donated Nu Skin® products to be included in the Twinkling Gift Boxes.

SOUTH ASIA/ PACIFIC

INDONESIA

Nu Skin employees hosted 60 pediatric heart patients with the support of the Southeast Asia Children's Heart Fund program. The children received dance lessons and got the chance to meet the Children's Heart Fund Honorary Board and Board Members.

MALAYSIA

Nu Skin Malaysia employees and distributors hosted an educational tour of the KL Bird Park for the pediatric heart patients they sponsor through the IJN Foundation and Gleneagles Kuala Lumpur. The children explored and learned about different species of birds through a guided tour that ended with lunch.

PHILIPPINES

In celebration of Nu Skin Philippines' 20th Anniversary, employees helped with "Bags to School" by donating 200 school bags and 200 sets of school supplies to 200 children in need.

SINGAPORE

Sales leaders and employees from Nu Skin Singapore distributed goodie bags to children at the KK Women and Children Hospital.

THAILAND

Employees and sales leaders in Thailand participated in Art for Heart, a program that provides art activities for children.

VIETNAM

Nu Skin Vietnam combined Force for Good Day and International Children's Day by donating 100 gifts of food and toys, along with performances and balloon art, to 100 kids in Ho Chi Minh and 100 kids in Hanoi.

NOURISH THE CHILDREN

At Nu Skin we care about feeding the world's most malnourished children. Nourish the Children (NTC) is a for-profit initiative that addresses the problem of childhood hunger in a sustainable manner. Since 2002, Nu Skin's family of sales leaders, customers, and employees have donated more than **600 million meals** to malnourished children around the world.

The program begins with VitaMeal®, a highly nutritious food developed by Nu Skin's nutritional scientists. The company's sales leaders, customers and employees can purchase VitaMeal and choose to donate the food to a third-party non-profit organization that specializes in distributing relief to those suffering from malnutrition and famine.

*Nu Skin is a for-profit distributor of nutritional and skin care product throughout Asia, the Americas, Europe, Africa and the Pacific and is traded on the New York Stock Exchange (NUS). Nourish the Children is an initiative of Nu Skin and is registered in some states as a commercial co-venture. The initiative enables Nu Skin distributors and customers to purchase VitaMeal from Nu Skin and donate it to charitable organizations to help solve the complex world problem of feeding malnourished children. The price of VitaMeal includes the cost of manufacturing, general overhead, distribution and sales. As is the case with other Nu Skin products, distributors are paid commissions and Nu Skin earns a profit margin from each sale of VitaMeal.

VITAMEAL[®], A SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION TO A GLOBAL PROBLEM



VITAMEAL: A LIFESAVING MEAL

Malnourished children are missing key nutrients in their diets, which can hinder brain, bone, and immune system development. Most humanitarian food consists of mainly grains, such as corn, which may lack other essential nutrients necessary for healthy development. As part of the overall development of VitaMeal, Nu Skin's nutritional scientists determined the ingredients and rations that are well-suited for a malnourished child. The result is VitaMeal, a nutrient-dense food fortified with essential vitamins and minerals.

MEET SARAH

Sweet Sarah has been enrolled in Convoy of Hope's Children's Feeding program since she was just 4 years old. Her father died when she was young, and her mother was too young to care for her. Unable to provide the support that she needed, Sarah's grandmother placed her in an orphanage where she received VitaMeal as one of her meals. Sarah is now 13 and getting ready to go into the 7th grade. When she's not participating in school activities, she's usually drawing. Sarah hopes to become an artist one day, and because of VitaMeal, she has the energy to pursue her dream.

Sarah is just one of the many children who receives VitaMeal thanks to those who purchase and donate. Many of these kids live in areas with limited access to clean water and health services. Their families rely on the meals these children receive each day. When asked how she feels now, Sarah says, "I feel good! I eat two to three times a day and have energy to play. Thank you for your support." Thank you for helping change the world—one child at a time.



VITAMEAL: MORE THAN JUST A MEAL

The Nourish the Children initiative partners with third-party, non-profit organizations that specialize in delivering relief where it is most needed. In addition to distributing VitaMeal, these partners leverage the positive effect of VitaMeal to create an even greater impact. For example, in many countries, VitaMeal is part of the school lunch programs that encourage families to send their children to school to gain an education.

Nu Skin manufactures VitaMeal in Malawi, China, and the United States to help reduce transportation costs and boost local economies.

VitaMeal is used in many ways to help malnourished children and has become more than just a meal; it brings hope to many young lives around the world.

VITAMEAL BY THE NUMBERS

In 2018, **44 million meals** were purchased and donated through the Nourish the Children initiative and distributed to children in great need around the world.
